

2015 SEASON PREVIEW



After finishing as Conference Runner Up in the Chicagoland Collegiate Athletic Conference (CCAC) and NAIA National Tournament participant, people knew the Tigers were back on the prowl. A great returning core along with six new freshmen and two junior college transfers are excited to make their own mark in the CCAC and the NAIA.

These strong returners had quality playing time last season against some of the best teams in the nation: senior Becky DeRuiter, MB, First-Team CCAC; senior Renee Enz, setter; senior Melissa Bartholomew, DS; junior Katie Tabisz, setter/hitter, Second-Team CCAC; sophomore Jeslyn Roat, OH hitter; and sophomore Kelsey Geiman, DS/libero.

A spring Division I tournament at the University of Chicago showcased some major improvements for sophomore Rachel Kirby, RS hitter; and sophomore Michaela Marino, DS.

Returning from injuries for the 2015 season are senior Melissa Bartholomew and sophomore Leah Lagestee.

Coach Williams knew she had to replace four quality seniors from last season who all started for the Tigers, so she hit the recruiting trail, 6-foot-2 freshman Brittany Neal, middle/OPP, from Arizona; 6-foot-1 freshman Lizzie Jackson, middle, from Indiana; 5-foot-9 junior Emma Ross, OH/DS, from Illinois Central College; 5-foot-8 junior Iliana Chakarova, OH/DS, from Bansko, Bulgaria, via Paris (Texas) Junior College; 5-foot-10 freshman Ellie Adamson, setter, from California; 5-foot-9 freshman Taylor Delbridge, OH, from Michigan. Coach Williams also snagged two Illini Elite players, 5-foot-9 Alex Ewalt, OH/DS, from Olympia High School in Danvers; and 5-foot-6 freshman Hannah Collins, libero, from Normal Community West High School. The Tigers have many new faces but will rely heavily on the experience of the returning players.

We look forward to having depth in every position and being able to create a very competitive culture to help prepare us for national and conference play.

Look for the CCAC to be very competitive next fall as we will again use our national level out of conference schedule to help us prepare for conference play. In May, we graduated four quality seniors, and one of our top assistant coaches — Luke Ward — left the program to take the women's volleyball head coaching job at Trinity International University. We were fortunate to add Jill Hird as assistant coach. Returning for a second year in their positions are graduate assistant coaches Rachelle Wiegand and Morgan Fox. We are excited to begin another chapter of ONU Volleyball history.

One night, SI had a community outreach in the community of Corocito. All 40 Americans that were at SI during the two weeks went up the mountain to Corocito to watch Olivet take on the boys in the community. Some of the Americans did a skit, and the gospel was presented. It was a special night for the team to be able to play volleyball together! Olivet volleyball players are thankful for the opportunity to travel together to another country. It was two weeks of growth, ministry and fun. Although the girls left part of their hearts in Jarabacoa, they are excited to use and share what they learned in the beautiful country of the Dominican Republic with people in the United States.

The team took a trip to Uptown Chicago during preseason. Coaches and players spent the morning serving food in a homeless shelter and cleaning up a parking lot in the area. The team loved serving alongside each other and learning to bond through hard work.




