#### **ACADEMICS**



By most accounts, the 2015 season would have been considered a successful one, having won 15 games, losing just five and tying the number one ranked team in the country. However, for a perennial powerhouse like the Olivet Nazarene University women' soccer team, the post season run was disappointing and fell far short of expectations. But, 2016 is a new beginning...a new season.

New, however, doesn't always mean easier. With the loss of standout forwards Betsy Hetrick and Liz Wahl to graduation, the Tigers have some huge shoes to fill on the offensive side of the ball. On the plus side, defensively the Tigers return their entire back line.

Entering his 18th season at the helm of the Tigers, Head Coach Bill Bahr, never backs down from a challenge and his 2016 schedule is proof of that. Bahr and the Tigers will face six teams who appear in the NAIA Coaches Top-25 Coaches Poll, including top ranked, defending National Champion, Spring Arbor University (Mich.) and No. 2 Lindsey Wilson College (Ky.). Olivet will open the season on Thursday, September 3 facing No. 19 Viterbo University (Iowa). The Chicagoland Collegiate Athletics Conference (CCAC), traditionally one of the strongest women's soccer conferences in the country, won't be easy with the addition of Saint Ambrose University (Iowa). The Fighting Bees joined the conference last season, and are currently ranked No. 15. Trinity International University (Ill.) and Robert Morris University-Illinois are also getting some looks, receiving votes in the preseason poll.



# SEASON REVIEW



### 2015 Highlights

The 2015 Olivet Nazarene University Lady Tigers had a good season finishing second in both the Chicagoland Collegiate Athletic Conference Regular Season and Tournament, with a final overall record of 15-5-1 and 10-2 in conference play. There were a number of highlights for the season, including an early season tie with eventual NAIA National Runner-Up Lindsey Wilson College (Ky.) 2-2. Results like this, along with victories against nationally ranked Cumberland University would help the Tigers to hold on to their NAIA Top 25 Coaches poll ranking.

Other highlights included rewriting the record book as senior forward Betsy Hetrick shattered four long standing school records. Hetrick broke a long time record for most career points set by Emily Ouimette, setting the new

mark at 155. Hetrick also tied the records for most point and most goals scored in one game, netting five goals against Calumet College of St. Joseph (Ind.). Hetrick topped off her string of records by toppling Michelle Davis's record of 62 career goals, finishing with 68. Hetrick finished the season as the third highest goal scorer in the NAIA, as a result Hetrick was named NAIA Second Team All-America.

Hetrick was not the only player to receive accolades in 2015. Five Tigers were selected to the CCAC All Conference Team: Betsy Hetrick, Liz Wahl, Tess Marcordes, Michelle Ditchfield, Sarah Vrosh. Liz and Sarah would also be named to the NAIA All Americans Honorable Mention team. Five players, Julia Luecke, Ellen West, Jenna Ayers, Sarah Vrosh, and Michelle Ditchfield,

were also selected as Daktronics-NAIA Scholar-Athletes, having maintained a 3.5 G.P.A through the completion of their sophomore year. As a team, the Tigers finished the year with an average team GPA of 3.45, earning the distinction of NAIA Scholar Team. The Tigers will have its challenges as they enter the 2016 year. Hetrick and Wahl combined accounted for 42 of the 73 goals scored for the team in 2015; both were seniors. The Tigers will need to change the way they play and learn to rely less on the power house forwards they have had in the past to be successful. However there are some very talented incoming forwards that may be able to fill void left behind by the dynamic duo.
